## 4. Teacher's Report

Rachelle (Cory)
A. OPHEA Healthy Schools quest for GOLD. The Healthy Schools Approach engages the whole school community to promote and enhance the health and well-being of children, youth, school staff, and the broader community. Healthy Schools Certification is based on a 4-Step Healthy Schools Process, inspired by the Canadian Healthy School Standards and Canada's Comprehensive School Health Framework. This process helps a school to plan and implement a range of activities that promote well-being in the school community, focusing on health topic(s) that are important to the school. Through a point-based system, over the course of the school year, schools will be able to plan their Healthy Schools process steps online and apply for Gold, Silver, or Bronze certification. The Director of the SCDSB has requested that all schools achieve GOLD certification this school year.
a. Mrs. Rossignol and Mr. Sclater have been working on completing this 4 step process and we are happy to say that we have submitted all 4 Steps of Healthy Schools Certification!
b. Now we need to hang tight! The HS Certification Team will conduct an audit of our schools' submissions. We will find out at the end of May our school's final results!
B. Jr. Boys \& Girls Basketball is wrapping up. The Boys won zones on April 19th and are moving on to the next step. If they win at Crossovers they will go on to the regionals held on April 27 at Algonquin. Junior Girls Zones was today. If they win that, CIties will be on May 4 at Eastview SS

vi. The School Calendar is located at the bottom of the Home page. It is auto-populated with events that the board has imputed in the Board Calendar however individual school events need to be added at the school level.
E. Chess Club has been meeting every week since November. Miss Rosebush has a consistent 10-14 student turnout each week. Earlier in the year there were two after-school tournaments where Mr. Sorley from Sunnybrae PS came to show the club a tournament format. This is where they learned how to use timers, show good sportsmanship, and follow the "touch move, touch take" rule. This was a great rehearsal for the area tournament that took place on March 2nd. Students from grades 3-8 competed against 4 other schools in our area at Sunnybrae PS. It was a phenomenal day with lots of smiles. Two students placed on the podiums: Andy H in grade 7 and Sebastian N in grade 8. Miss. Rosebush brought those two players to the SCDSB Board Office on March 29th. Similar to the March 2 tournament, they used the SWISS system to track scores. There were 6 rounds to make a full day from 9:30 am - 2:30 pm. Both competitors fought hard and showed exceptional sportsmanship. Sebi finished with 13 points (placed 5th or 6th) and Andy finished with 12 points (placed 7th or 8th). The chess club will continue to meet once a week until the end of the school year!
