PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Thank you to everyone who was able to make it to the school on the 28th for the "Meet the Teacher/Educator" evening. We had another great turnout and were thrilled to see so many families connecting with their children's educators and that you were able to meet some classmates and their families. I hope that everyone managed to sign up for a parent/teacher conference coming on November 16 (evening)-17th (morning). If you have not yet connected with the regular classroom teacher, please reach out to book a time for a meeting to discuss student learning to this point in the year.

Our first School Council Meeting and Election took place near the end of September, and we were very excited to welcome several new faces—we also appreciate the commitment of all returning members of Council. Our council is made up of several parents, a teacher, a gr. 8 student and administration. Specific roles include the co-chairs, treasurer, and secretary but most members are simply 'parents at large' with voting powers. At meetings we discuss what is going on in our school, share information and plan events and fundraising. Occasionally, we vote on how funds raised will be used to support student learning and school climate. We also have several parents who support us by attending regularly and lending a hand to make our initiatives a success. Beyond fundraising efforts, our council members, and highly involved parents are often our most reliable volunteers who work very hard to ensure that all children have fun and exciting things happening at school that make them want to come to school and to learn each day. Council's hard work in this area ensures that the school can purchase and pay for a variety of things that make our school great—not the least of which is the extra-curricular sports and activities. Thank you to all the families who support these offerings through participation in our lunch programs or other fundraisers etc. Our next meeting will be held in the library at 6:30 pm on Monday Oct. 23rd. FYI—in the Winter months we plan to run meetings virtually, online with a link being sent only to those who contact the office to share their interest in attending.

In other news, we regret the necessity of closing the playground temporarily. We expect the sand to be re-tilled by the middle of next week which will allow us to reopen it for use during recess. We try to make the most of our outdoor spaces while the weather cooperates and Sept/early Oct. have been fantastic! Families should be prepared though for the rainy days that will eventually complicate our entry and dismissal routines. On rainy mornings we will ring the bell and invite students to enter beginning at 8:55 (the time that supervision on the yard begins). It is important that each student enter through their regular door so that we can ensure supervision is in place and each child is able to get to their classroom safely. We always see a large increase in the number of drivers on rainy days. Please be aware that our regular routine and expectations for safe use of the school parking lot remain the same; students should only enter/exit vehicle in a parking spot or from the kiss-n-ride lane. Please pull forward so that the cars behind you do not stack up all the way back to the sidewalk where they create a hazard for those braving the rain. The bus lane at the front remains closed. As always, we love to see so many families choosing to walk and the number of bicycles in our racks has been inspiring. Keep it up!

OCTOBER PA DAY

Below is a summary of the activities planned for the Oct. 20 PA Day:

Length: Full day
Topic: Health and Safety, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, and Mathematics
Host: Simcoe County District School Board
Presenter(s)/facilitator(s): School board staff and school administrators and school leads

Educators will participate in a half-day Health and Safety digital learning session focused on health and safety incident reporting and investigations with a particular emphasis on the essential aspect of workplace violence prevention. The session will equip staff with the knowledge and tools to report incidents effectively and promptly, provide insights into the investigative and risk mitigation process, fostering transparency and accountability, and highlight the critical role staff play in preventing workplace injuries.

Educators will learn about Somali, Latino, South Asian, and African Black Indigenous heritage. They will collaboratively plan within grades and divisions. Through this, they will celebrate identities and create environments that foster well-being and sense of belonging.

Educators will choose learning related to the Knowledgehook digital math tool based on their readiness. Different learning pathways have been planned for new users, those with some experience, and those who are ready to extend their use of the math tool. All participants will learn about how to invite parents/guardians to view their child's progress. Additionally, educators will engage in High Impact Instructional Practices in Mathematics learning modules that align with their school's Achievement in Mathematics goal.

It's a great opportunity for the school community to thank our bus drivers for all their hard work transporting students to and from school safely.

INCLEMENT WEATHER AND BUS CANCELLATION INFORMATION REMINDER

All information regarding cancelled buses in Simcoe County is posted on the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC)'s bus information website at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca. Our school is in the **CENTRAL** zone. When buses are cancelled, schools remain open for student learning, unless otherwise noted. School staff are expected to plan for such emergencies in order to transition students who are unable to attend due to inclement weather, to their online platforms (Google Classroom and/or SCDSBhub [Brightspace by D2L]) and continue with academic programming. It is always a family decision whether or not it is safe for their child(ren) to leave for school under severe weather conditions.

The Consortium and bus operators try to make the decision to cancel school buses before 6 a.m. and make every effort to post announcements before 7 a.m. Inclement weather cancellations are effective for the whole day and buses cancelled in the morning will not run at the end of the day. SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION AVAILABLE FROM THE SCSTC

In order to receive delay and cancellation notifications, families can check the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC) website at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca or download the 'BusPlanner Delays' app from the Apple or Android app stores to receive delay notifications to their devices. Users would need to select Simcoe County STC as the transportation authority. The app will need to be forced closed, but you will be able to select your student(s) routes or school to receive delays.

The app will send a general notice for any cancellation in Simcoe County. You only need to know which 'zone' you're in, so you would know which one to look out for in the app. You can find your student's zone by visiting the School Bus Status page at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca and clicking the dropdown for the area you live in.

There are many benefits to walking or wheeling to school. Walking or wheeling to school reduces traffic, helps students establish healthy lifestyles, is better for the environment and enhances community safety. UPCOMING IN-PERSON GRADE 1 FRENCH IMMERSION INFORMATION SESSIONS

The Simcoe County District School Board (SCDSB) offers French Immersion (FI) at select schools throughout Simcoe County beginning in Grade 1. The goal of the FI program is to enable students to communicate in French with a high level of proficiency, enabling them to function with ease in both English and French.

Information sessions for families who are considering entry into Grade 1 FI for the 2024-25 school year will take place at Warnica Public School, 211 Warnica Road, November 13th, 2023 (time TBA) and online applications will open in December 2023.

Entry into the FI program will be determined through a digitally randomized lottery system. A link to access the Grade 1 FI online application form will be available on the SCDSB website starting at 9 a.m. on Friday, Dec. 1 until 4 p.m. on Friday, Dec. 15. 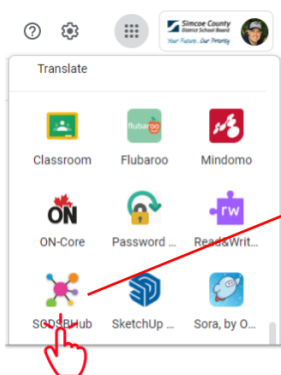
SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD WITH MATH

TVO Mathify offers free 1:1 online grade 4-12 math tutoring to scdsb students. connect with an Ontario certified teacher of your choice. it is anonymous and secure, and can be used from a phone, tablet, or computer. Math tutors are available from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. et Monday to Friday, and 3:30 to 9 p.m. et Sunday.

All SCDSB students from grades 4-12 have been pre-registered for this amazing service. for quick access to TVO mathify:

Your child will not need to enter their OEN number or any identifying information when two mathify is accessed through the scdsbhub.



REVISED 2023 ONTARIO LANGUAGE CURRICULUM

Beginning this school year, all language programs for grades 1-8 will be based on the expectations of the revised Ontario language curriculum. The Ontario Curriculum, grades 1 to 8: Language, 2023 outlines the knowledge and skills required for effective reading and writing, listening, and speaking, so that students can succeed at school and beyond. The curriculum has been revised partly in response to the recommendations outlined in the Ontario Human Rights Commission's Right to Read Public Inquiry Report.

The 2023 curriculum now includes four strands: literacy connections and applications:

1. foundations of language
2. comprehension: understanding and responding to texts.
3. composition: expressing ideas and creating texts.
